

FRAUD ALERT

You only have to set up 1 fraud alert with just 1 of the three main credit bureaus.
By law the one reported to must inform the other 2.
The fraud alert is good for 90 days.
A fraud alert prevents new lines of credit from being opened.

This is how to place a fraud alert on Equifax.

1-800-525-6285

Press 1 for 90 day fraud alert. Enter social security number.

Enter your house number.

Enter last 2 digits of date of birth.

Enter your day time phone number. (include area code)

Enter your evening phone number. (include area code)

You will then be given a confirmation number. (make sure you write this down)

You then conclude the Equifax fraud alert.

This is how to place a fraud alert on Experian.

1-888-397-3742 Press 2 for all other.

Press 2 again for all others

Press 3 (if you believe your credit file is a risk of being used fraudulently)

Press 2 to add an alert via their automated system

Press 1 to add 90 day alert.

Press 2 to continue

Enter social security number followed by # key.

Enter 5 digit zip code followed by # key. Enter your house number followed by # key.

Enter your phone number. (include area code)

You will then be given a confirmation code. (make sure you write this down)

This is how to place a fraud alert on TransUnion.

1-800-680-7289 Stay on the line for assistance.

Enter or say your zip code. Press or say 1 to add a fraud alert.

Enter or say your social security number. Listen as it is read back to make sure it is correct.

Enter or say your 6 digit date of birth. January 1, 1962 would be 01 01 62 follow this with #key.

Enter or say your 4 digit year of birth.

Enter or say your street number followed by the # key.

Enter your 10 digit day time phone number. Listen as it is read back ,if correct say "yes."

Enter your 10 digit evening phone number. Listen as it is read back, if correct say "yes."

Stay on the line for confirmation.
