Annual Curb Ramp Project \$175,000

Required by the Federal American Disabilities Act (ADA) Regulations—installation program follows the previous year's asphalt program and other priority corridors. Additional locations are added as funds allow.





Pavement Condition Survey \$179,000

- Requirement to assess roadway pavement every three (3) years, at a minimum
- Assessment is used to determine roadways that become part of the annual maintenance project, as well as roadways that require more substantial work or rebuild
- Information also used for City's annual audit and for GASB 34

Broadwell/UPRR Grade Separation \$420,000/\$34,210,000

- Address solutions to vehicle traffic conflicts with railroad crossing
- Anticipate 10 year process to acquire funds (began FY 2019)



- Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) Study finished
- City entered into program agreement with NDOT October 2022 (80/20 match)
- Environmental/preliminary engineering began FY24
- Construction is estimated to begin FY28

Locust St; 2nd St to Fonner Park Rd \$6,500,000 / \$16,100,000

- Full depth replacement of roadway with concrete curb and gutter
- Remedy alignment issues at intersections along corridor
- Drainage improvements
- Finish Engineering and ROW late FY 2024 into FY 2025
- Construction FY 2025/2026
- \$1.8M of overall project cost is for water and sanitary sewer improvements, which will be paid for by the respective funds





Claude Road; State Street to 13th Street \$2,441,500 / \$7,265,700

- Currently under construction
- First step to Diers Avenue congestion
 - Future project will control access

 (a) Diers Avenue
- Concrete curb and gutter section with sidewalk, traffic control, drainage and other associated improvements









State Street Median Improvements \$180,000 / \$3,380,000


- Improvements to aid in traffic flow
- Access restrictions
- Engineering FY25, Construction FY26



Stuhr Rd- Dual NB Lefts @ US Hwy 30 \$949,000 / \$1,076,400

- Aid in traffic flow at US Highway 30 and Stuhr Road
- Working on potential partnership with JBS to extend turn lanes further south to serve parking lot drives
 - Pending JBS budget approval in Nov/Dec 2024
 - Agreement to City Council shortly after, if JBS approve

*shows total project cost assuming JBS will cover approximately \$323,000, if not approved project cost will decrease



Locust St; US Hwy 34 to Wood River Diversion \$250,000 / \$3,059,900

- Improvements to roadway
- Pavement failures due to geotech subgrade issues





Stolley Park Rd; State Fair Entrance to Stuhr Rd \$300,000 / \$2,968,680

Widen roadway to allow for a common turn lane





Independence Ave; Capital Ave to Manchester Rd/Macron St

\$3,000,000 / \$4,000,000

- Street and drainage improvements
- Widen Independence Avenue by George Park
- Pave Macron for detour route and Jay Street while in the area
- Construction FY25










Wood River Diversion Bridge \$500,000

Improve driving surface



N 80 Wetland Delineation

\$2,100,000/\$3,081,400

- City owned wetland bank
- Anticipated this will double as a detention cell to allow additional water storage on the north end of town
- ▼ Improve drainage depths in Moores Creek within the City
- Continue Engineering/Permitting
- Currently in USACE public notice period
- Wetland areas can be sold or kept for City use



Sidewalk Cost Share Program

\$25,000

- Per Ordinance No. 9764
- Repair displaced, broken, and/or ADA deficient sidewalks in the public ROW
- Construct segments of sidewalk to fill in the network along streets within City limits
- 7 applications received in FY2024, with \$10,274.72 paid out (including engineering services) to date



PVIP Drainage District No. 2020-1 \$350,000/\$600,000

- Design and construction of drainage outlet in the Platte Valley Industrial Park area
- City portion of a partnership with Hall County, CPNRD & GIAEDC
- City cost will be partially recouped by assessment district created in 2019, with remaining to be funded by City (approx. \$190k)




Citywide Drainage \$50,000

- Annual evaluation, which will use data collected over past years to improve drainage in various areas of the City
- Develop hydraulic computer models to analyze performance of storm sewers
- Identify weaknesses or improvements that will increase storm sewer capacity and plan future work
- Examples in FY23 include
 - Locust St model- done
 - ₹ 7th St & Eddy St area model- in progress
 - Stolley Park Rd & Blaine St detention model- in progress




3rd St Drainage Improvements \$400,000

 Project developed from Citywide drainage study



Tri St Drainage Improvements \$50,000 / \$616,650

- Complaints of poor drainage with recent development on Tri St
- Need proper outlet
 - Pipe to Locust St
 - Allow for paving Tri St
 - Knott development outlet
 - Possible future Rainbow Subdivision overflow
 - Coordinate/share cost with Knott development
- Construction FY2024
 - Concrete curb and gutter street
