





Streets are plowed based on priority.

Emergency Routes are the number one priority because they carry the most amount of traffic and allow emergency services to travel safely to service calls.

No shoveling or plowing snow into the streets. Streets are cleared for the safety of the traveling public and depositing snow into the street creates a hazard.

Own It! Take a look at your daily, routine activities to determine if winter weather will affect them. Make adjustments and plan ahead so you are ready when the snow falls.

Wait for the plows to pass. Try to wait until the plows have passed before clearing your driveway. This will keep you from having to shovel the driveway twice. If you cannot wait then try out the tip below.

Reduce the Chances of Shoveling your Driveway

Twice....



- Create a landing strip.
 Clear an area before the driveway where snow accumulated on the plows.
- accumulated on the plows can land.

 2. Go with the flow.
- Shovel snow in the same

direction as traffic and pile snow downstream of the driveway.


VEHICLE TOWS AND SNOW

What you need to know

During a declared snow emergency vehicles will be ticketed and towed from designated routes. §22-113

DURING

- Snowbound vehicles will be ticketed and towed from any street after 72 hours. § 22-99
- No Parking in the downtown district from 12 midnight to 8am during any snow removal. § 22-112
