Sealed bids will be received at the office of the City Clerk, 100 E. First Street, P.O. Box 1968, Grand Island, Nebraska 68802, until Friday, March 1, 2013 at 2:15 p.m. local time for Turbine Valve Screens, FOB the City of Grand Island, freight prepaid. Bids will be publicly opened at this time in the Grand Island City Hall Council Conference Room #1 located on 1st floor of City Hall. Submit <u>an original and three copies</u>. Bid proposal package is also available on-line at <u>www.grand-island.com</u> under Business-Bid Calendars. Bids received after the specified time will be returned unopened to sender.

The successful bidder will be required to comply with fair labor standards as required by Nebraska R.R.S.73-102 and comply with Nebraska R.R.S. 48-657 pertaining to contributions to the Unemployment Compensation Fund of the State of Nebraska. Successful bidder shall maintain a drug free workplace policy. Every public contractor and his, her or its subcontractors who are awarded a contract by the City for the physical performance of services within the State of Nebraska shall register with and use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska.

Each bidder shall submit with the bid a certified check, a cashiers check, or bid bond payable to the City Treasurer in an amount no less than five percent (5%) of the bid price which shall guarantee good faith on the part of the bidder and the entering into a contract within fourteen (14) days at the bid price if accepted by the City. Your certified check, cashier's check or bid bond must be submitted in a separate envelope attached to the outside of the envelope containing the bid. Each envelope must be clearly marked indicating its contents. Failure to submit the necessary qualifying information in clearly marked and separate envelopes will result in your bid not being opened or considered. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. GENERAL INFORMATION.

The following instructions outline the procedure for preparing and submitting Bids. Bidders must fulfill all requirements as specified in these Documents.

2. TYPE OF BID.

Bidders shall be required to submit prices for all items listed in the Bid Data Forms.

PREPARATION OF BIDS.

Bidders shall use only the Bid Data Forms provided in these Documents. All blank spaces in the Bid Data Forms must be filled in, preferably in BLACK ink, in both words and figures where required. No changes to the wording or content of the forms is permitted. Written amounts shall govern in case of discrepancy between the amounts stated in writing and the amounts stated in figures.

Prices stated shall be f.o.b. with freight and full insurance paid by Bidder, to the job site located in Grand Island, Nebraska.

The Bidder shall acknowledge receipt of all Addenda in the Bid Data Forms. Bids received without acknowledgement or without the Addendum enclosed will be considered informal.

4. SUBMISSION OF BIDS.

All Bids must be submitted intact no later than the time prescribed, at the place, and in the manner set forth in the ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS. Bids must be made on the Bid Data Forms provided herein. Each Bid must be submitted intact in a sealed envelope, so marked as to indicate its contents without being opened, and delivered in person or addressed and mailed in conformance with the instructions in the ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS.

5. BID SECURITY.

Bids must be accompanied by cash, a certified check, or cashier's check drawn on a bank which is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, or a bid bond issued by a Surety authorized to issue such bonds in the state where the Work is located, in the amount of 5 percent of the bid amount payable to OWNER. This bid security shall be given as a guarantee that the Bidder will not withdraw his Bid for a period of thirty (30) days after bid opening, and that if awarded the Contract, the successful Bidder will execute the attached Contract and furnish a properly executed Performance Bond and Payment Bond, each in the full amount of the Contract price, within the time specified.

The Attorney-in-Fact that executes this bond on behalf of the Surety must attach a notarized copy of his/her power of attorney as evidence of his/her authority to bind the Surety on the date of execution of the bond. Where State Statue requires, certification by a resident agent shall also be provided.

6. RETURN OF BID SECURITY.

Within fifteen (15) days after the award of the Contract, the OWNER will return the bid securities to all Bidders whose Bids are not to be further considered in awarding the Contract. All other retained bid securities will be held until the Contract has been finally executed, after which all bid securities, other than Bidders' bonds and guarantees which have been fortified, will be returned to the respective Bidders whose Bids they accompanied.

7. BASIS OF AWARD.

The award will be made by the OWNER on the basis of the Bid from the lowest responsive, responsible Bidder which, in the OWNER's sole and absolute judgment will best serve the interest of the OWNER. All Bids will be considered on the following basis:

Conformance with the terms of the Bid Documents Bid price.

Delivery Time.

Cost of installation.

Responsibility and qualification of Bidder.

Suitability to project requirements.

The OWNER reserves the right to reject all Bids, or any Bid not in conformance with the intent of the Bid Documents, and to waive any informalities and irregularities in said Bids.

8. EXECUTION OF CONTRACT.

The successful Bidder shall, within fifteen (15) days after receiving notice of award, sign and deliver to the OWNER the Contract hereto attached together with the acceptable bonds as required in these Bid Documents. Within fifteen (15) days after receiving the signed Contract with acceptable bond(s) from the successful Bidder, the OWNER's authorized agent will sign the Contract. Signature by both parties constitutes execution of the Contract.

9. PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BONDS.

The successful Bidder shall file with the OWNER Performance and Payment Bonds in the full amount (100 percent) of the Contract price, as security for the faithful performance of the Contract and the payment of all persons supplying labor and materials for the Work under this Contract, and to cover all guarantees against defective workmanship or materials, or both, for a period of one (1) year after the date of final acceptance of the Work by the OWNER. The Surety furnishing these bonds shall have a record of service satisfactory to the OWNER, be authorized to do business in the State where the OWNER's project is located and shall be named on the current list of approved Surety Companies. acceptable on Federal bonds as published by the Audit Staff, Bureau of Accounts, U.S. Treasury Department.

The Attorney-in-Fact (Resident Agent) who executes these bonds on behalf of the Surety must attach a notarized copy of his/her power-of-attorney as evidence of his/her authority to bind the Surety on the date of execution of the bond.

10. TIME OF COMPLETION.

The time of completion of the Work to be performed under this Contract is the essence of the Contract. The time allowed for the completion of the Work is stated in the Bid Data Forms.

11. GRATUITIES AND KICKBACKS.

City Code states that it is unethical for any person to offer, give, or agree to give any City employee or former City employee, or for any City employee or former City employee to solicit, demand, accept, or agree to accept from another person, a gratuity or an offer of employment in connection with any decision, approval, disapproval, recommendation, or preparation of any part of a program requirement or a purchase request, influencing the content of any specification or procurement standard, rendering of advice, investigation, auditing, or in any other advisory capacity in any proceeding or application, request for ruling, determination, claim or controversy, or other particular matter, pertaining to any program requirement or a contract or subcontract, or to any solicitation or proposal therefor. It shall be unethical for any payment, gratuity, or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor or any person associated therewith, as an inducement for the award of a subcontract or order.

12. FISCAL YEAR.

The City of Grand Island, Nebraska operates on a fiscal year beginning October 1st and ending on the following September 30th. It is understood and agreed that any portion of this agreement which will be performed in a future fiscal year is contingent upon the City Council adopting budget statements and appropriations sufficient to fund such performance.

CONTRACT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between [SUCCESSFUL BIDDER], hereinafter called the Contractor, and the CITY OF GRAND ISLAND, NEBRASKA, hereinafter called the City.

WITNESSETH:

THAT, WHEREAS, in accordance with law, the City has caused contract documents to be prepared and an advertisement calling for bids to be published for *TURBINE VALVE SCREENS*; and

WHEREAS, the City, in the manner prescribed by law, has publicly opened, examined, and canvassed the bids submitted, and has determined the aforesaid Contractor to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, and has duly awarded to said Contractor a contract therefore, for the sum or sums named in the Contractor's bid, a copy thereof being attached to and made a part of this Contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the compensation to be paid to the Contractor and of the mutual agreements herein contained, the parties have agreed and hereby agree, the City for itself and its successors, and the Contractor for itself, himself/herself, or themselves, and its, his/her, or their successors, as follows:

<u>ARTICLE I</u>. That the following documents shall comprise the Contract, and shall together be referred to as the "Agreement" or the "Contract Documents";

- 1. This Contract Agreement.
- 2. City of Grand Island's Specification for this project.
- 3. [NAME OF SUCCESSFUL BIDDER] bid signed and dated [DATE OF BID].

In the event of any conflict between the terms of the Contract Documents, the provisions of the document first listed shall prevail.

ARTICLE II. That the Contractor shall (a) furnish all tools, equipment, superintendence, transportation, and other construction materials, services and facilities; (b) furnish, as agent for the City, all materials, supplies and equipment specified and required to be incorporated in and form a permanent part of the completed work; (c) provide and perform all necessary labor; and (d) in a good substantial and workmanlike manner and in accordance with the requirements, stipulations, provisions, and conditions of the Contract documents as listed in the attached General Specifications, said documents forming the Contract and being as fully a part thereof as if repeated verbatim herein, perform, execute, construct and complete all work included in and covered by the City's official award of this Contract to the said Contractor, such award being based on the acceptance by the City of the Contractor's bid;

ARTICLE III. That the City shall pay to the Contractor for the performance of the work embraced in this Contract and the Contractor will accept as full compensation therefore the sum (subject to adjustment as provided by the Contract) of [DOLLAR AMOUNT] (\$00.00) for all services, materials, and work covered by and included in the Contract award and designated in the foregoing Article II; payments thereof to be made in cash or its equivalent in the manner provided in the General Specifications.

It is understood and agreed that any portion of this agreement which will be performed in a future fiscal year is contingent upon the City Council adopting budget statements and appropriations sufficient to fund such performance.

ARTICLE IV. The Contractor hereby agrees to act as agent for the City in purchasing materials and supplies for the City for this project. The City shall be obligated to the vendor of the materials and supplies for the purchase price, but the Contractor shall handle all payments hereunder on behalf of the City. The vendor shall make demand or claim for payment of the purchase price from the City by submitting an invoice to the Contractor. Title to all materials and supplies purchased hereunder shall vest in the City directly from the vendor. Regardless of the method of payment, title shall vest immediately in the City. The Contractor shall not acquire title to any materials and supplies incorporated into the project. All invoices shall bear the Contractor's name as agent for the City. This paragraph will apply only to these materials and supplies actually incorporated into and becoming a part of the finished product of the TURBINE VALVE SCREENS.

<u>ARTICLE V</u>. That the Contractor shall start work as soon as possible after the Contract is signed and the required bonds and insurance are approved, and that the Contractor shall deliver the equipment, tools, supplies, and materials F.O.B. Platte Generating Station, and complete the work on or before *APRIL 8, 2013*.

ARTICLE VI. The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable State fair labor standards in the execution of this Contract as required by Section 73-102, R.R.S. 1943. The Contractor further agrees to comply with the provisions of Section 48-657, R.R.S. 1943, pertaining to contributions to the Unemployment Compensation Fund of the State of Nebraska. During the performance of this Contract, the Contractor and all subcontractors agree not to discriminate in hiring or any other employment practice on the basis, of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or disability. The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable Local, State and Federal rules and regulations. The Contractor agrees to maintain a drug-free workplace policy and will provide a copy of the policy to the City upon request. Every public contractor and his, her or its subcontractors who are awarded a contract by the City for the physical performance of services within the State of Nebraska shall register with and use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska.

ARTICLE VII. TURBINE VALVE SCREENS

DETAILED SPECIFICATIONS

SCOPE: The Contractor shall supply all material, labor, equipment, tooling, supervision, and technical expertise to disassemble and reassemble three (3) turbine valves at the Platte Generating Station for the purpose of removing the temporary screens installed in the fall of 2012. This will include project management, technical direction, field engineering, field labor and supervision, disassembly, cleaning, and reassembly.

<u>DESCRIPTION:</u> The Platte Generating Station is located at 1035 West Wildwood Drive, approximately two miles south of Grand Island, Nebraska.

The Unit 1 turbine generator is a 122,000 kva generator with a tandem-compound double flow, single reheat condensing turbine operating at main steam conditions of 1800 psi and 1000 F, and an exhaust pressure of 2.5 in. The Unit was manufactured by General Electric Company and is turbine No. 197789. The most recent major inspection was completed in November 2012.

BID SUBMITTALS: The Contractor shall include in their Bid the following items:

- Schedule for work to be completed.
- Water and electrical requirements and on-site project requirements.
- A reference list of recent projects similar in unit size, scope, and complexity to this specification shall be provided with the bid.

SERVICE RATES: The Contractor shall include in the Bid a firm lump sum price, including expenses, and all other standard terms and conditions which will be in effect during the project for the outage schedule shown. All turbine and valve parts will be furnished by the Owner and the Contractor shall furnish all consumables.

The Platte Generating Station requests a second firm lump sum Bid for the earliest completion schedule the Contractor can provide. This Bid should include information about schedule, manpower loading, and any special requirements.

The Bid shall also include, as a separate attachment, firm unit pricing for all labor, equipment and expenses for adjustments that may be required for work scope modifications. Any additional services other than what is required in this specification or deletions of specified services shall be billed at the quoted unit rates.

A single Contract will be awarded for all work included in the specification.

The Platte Generating Station is <u>NOT</u> tax exempt and is subject to a 7.0% sales tax rate. See the Nebraska Department of Revenue web site at <u>www.revenue.state.ne.us</u> for contractor's tax information.

REQUIREMENTS: The purpose of this overhaul is to disassemble three (3) turbine valves, remove the strainers, visually inspect the valves, and reassemble. The strainers will be turned over to plant personnel who will remove the temporary screens and return them to the Contractor for reassembly of the valves.

Main Stop Valve:

- Remove Cover and Strainer
- Visually examine the valve and steam strainers.
- Reinstall the strainer and cover
- Record bolt extensions.

Intercept Valves:

- Remove Covers and Strainers from two (2) valves
- Visually examine the valve components and steam strainers.

- Reinstall the Strainer and Cover
- Record bolt extensions.

The Contractor shall clean and prepare the bolting and specified components for reassembly according to standard industry practices.

If the Contractor proposes alternatives for consideration by the Owner other than as generally described herein for any portion of the work, full and complete descriptions must be included with the bid with separate pricing for the optional utilization of such proposed alternatives.

Bidder is solely responsible for obtaining any and all clarifications to this specification as may be required for the Bidder to submit an accurate and complete bid proposal.

NOTE: No foreign materials are permitted to be spilled on equipment, structures, plant site grounds, or roads. The Contractor shall maintain its equipment in top working condition to eliminate fluid leaks and equipment breakdowns that could delay the progress of the work. The Contractor is responsible for having onsite capability to take any and all extraordinary measures to fully contain and clean up any and all leaks from the Contractor's equipment, as well as to implement any and all necessary repairs to equipment as required to eliminate and avoid such leaks from further occurrence. The Contractor is responsible for clean-up of all fluids spilled the Contractor's equipment. Upon completion, the Contractor shall leave the premises in a neat and clean condition with respect to his/her own operation.

Contractor will coordinate closely with plant personnel on execution of all phases of the work and all safety requirements, including but not limited to:

- Provide information on all employees arriving at the Platte Generating Station
- Lock Out/Tag Out procedures
- Confined Space Entry procedures
- Platte Generating Station equipment operation, such as the turbine and valves
- Scheduling sequence of work scope items and related plant system preparations for work execution
- Inspections of completed work

Contractor shall be required to maintain accurate job logs detailing all work performed and a record of equipment hours and man hours as related to both the base scope work and any additional work ordered by the Owners Representatives beyond that specified herein. Such job logs shall identify all individuals by name, craft and all hours worked on each portion of all work.

Any equipment that is operated on an additional charge basis shall likewise be documented in the job log.

Within thirty (30) days after the outage completion, the Contractor shall provide three (3) copies of a written report along with one (1) electronic version to the Owner detailing any and all inspection results, repairs, readings and measurements, problems identified, and describing in detail any short-term and long-term maintenance recommendations.

OWNER PROVISIONS: Platte Generating Station (PGS) will provide:

- An Owner's designated representative for on-site coordination with PGS.
- Safety orientation for all Contractor employees as related to PGS site safety considerations.
- Dumpsters for trash and debris.
- Portable toilet facilities with hand wash stations.
- Potable water source for Contractor's drinking water containers.
- Designated Contractor parking on site.
- Electrical service connections for job trailers and equipment.
- An Insulation Contractor for removal and reinstallation of any valve insulation.
- A turbine room overhead crane operator.
- Turbine slings and rigging as currently available on site.

<u>QUALIFICATIONS:</u> The Contractor shall be a firm specializing in supervising and performing the maintenance, inspection, and repair of steam turbine generator stop valves and combination reheat/intercept valves of the design used on this unit and in the power generation industry. The Contractor shall be capable of providing direction and technical expertise during all stages of the turbine valve disassembly and reassembly. The Contractor shall substantiate its experience through the submittal of a similar projects reference list with the bid. The Contractor will be expected to perform the work without the assistance of Platte Generating Station personnel or tools, and comply with plant safety regulations and equipment tag out procedures.

<u>SUPERVISOR</u>: The Contractor shall provide a well-qualified Project Superintendent who shall be thoroughly familiar with General Electric valves used on this unit and have previous experience with these particular valve designs. All turbine equipment information available at PGS will be made available to the Contractor on site in order to assist with technical direction, as required. The Supervisor(s) will fully direct all field operations for the duration of the project, serve as liaison to the Owner's designated representative, be fully authorized to make any and all decisions affecting the work in the field and coordinate activities between the Contractor and Owner. A summary of the experience of the Supervisor proposed for this project shall be provided with the bid.

<u>Subcontractors</u>: The Contractor shall provide a separate attachment with the Bid identifying all subcontractors, the work to be performed by the subcontractor(s) and references reflecting the subcontractor's prior performance of similar work scope. All subcontractors are subject to review and approval by Owner and shall not be changed without prior notification, review and approval of the Owner.

<u>INSPECTION</u>: All work performed by the Contractor will be inspected by the Owner's designated representative or other assigned plant personnel upon notification by the Contractor that the Contractor considers that portion of the work completed.

SCHEDULE: The Unit will be taken off line by approximately 10 am on April 2, 2013. All work performed by the Contractor shall be completed by the end of the day on April 8, 2013. The unit will be placed back on line the morning of April 9, 2013. These schedule dates are fairly firm but remain subject to adjustments based on the needs of the Owner, due to common industry influences outside the control of the Owner. The Contractor's base bid shall be based on this schedule.

The Contractor is requested to bid a second schedule with the earliest completion the Contractor can provide. Details of this proposed schedule must be included with the bid.

The Contractor shall be responsible for selecting the days, shifts and hours of work as the Contractor deems essential to supporting the scope and bid requirements while developing competitive proposals. Access to the plant will be available at all times and the Contractor may determine working hours; however, the Owner's staff will only be available during normal, daytime, weekday working hours unless other arrangements are agreed to in advance.

No later than seven (7) days prior to the scheduled start of the outage, the Contractor shall furnish to the Owner a final detailed schedule showing the overhaul activities, job duration, job start and finish dates, and manpower loading.

The Contractor shall include in all schedules the time allotted for the removal of the temporary screens by the Owner's personnel and the time allotted for any required insulation work by the Owner's insulation Contractor.

SAFETY: The Contractor is required to follow all OSHA, state, and plant safety regulations. The Contractor is required to follow their OSHA regulations for work in areas that are contaminated with fly ash and for areas that may be considered as confined spaces. NOTE: All Contractors must submit with the bid a copy of their OSHA compliant Confined Space Procedure and Respiratory Protection Procedure. The Contractor will be required to provide proof that workers have successfully completed respiratory fit testing and pulmonary function testing and have been trained for confined space entry.

The Contractor shall be responsible for compliance with all safety practices as required by the regulatory agencies governing the Contractor's operations as well as any and all safety requirements of the Contractor's

organization and shall submit historical evidence of such compliance. All personnel working on site will be required to participate in the plant's safety orientation prior to performing any work on site at PGS.

The plant has an equipment tag out procedure to prevent the unauthorized starting of motors and the unauthorized movement of valves and dampers. The Contractor is encouraged to investigate the procedure and add its own tags on top of the plant tags if required. Removal of plant tags is not allowed and is cause for removal from the plant site.

<u>MATERIALS, EQUIPMENT, AND SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CONTRACTOR:</u> The Contractor shall provide all material, freight, equipment, labor, personnel protective equipment, tools, consumables, and supervision to fully perform the specified work without the assistance of the Owner's personnel.

<u>CLEAN-UP:</u> During the course of work, the Contractor shall daily clean up all debris, remove unnecessary scaffolding, equipment, and surplus material. Upon completion, the Contractor shall leave the premises in a neat and clean condition with respect to his/her own operation.

<u>PLANT ACCESS</u>: There is no separate contractor entrance at the Platte Generating Station. There is one gate with a card access security system and the Contractor may request to use access cards to gain entry rather than request entry for each entrance and exit. If cards are used the Contractor shall be responsible to return all access cards after the outage. There is a \$25.00 charge for every card that is not returned.

PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BONDS: The successful Bidder shall file with the OWNER Performance and Payment Bonds in the full amount (100 percent) of the Contract price, as security for the faithful performance of the Contract and the payment of all persons supplying labor and materials for the Work under this Contract, and to cover all guarantees against defective workmanship or materials, or both, for a period of one (1) year after the date of final acceptance of the Work by the OWNER. The Surety furnishing these bonds shall have a record of service satisfactory to the OWNER, be authorized to do business in the State where the OWNER's project is located and shall be named on the current list of approved Surety Companies, acceptable on Federal bonds as published by the Audit Staff, Bureau of Accounts, U.S. Treasury Department.

The Attorney-in-Fact (Resident Agent) who executes these bonds on behalf of the Surety must attach a notarized copy of his/her power-of-attorney as evidence of his/her authority to bind the Surety on the date of execution of the bond.

<u>DRAWINGS & SITE INFORMATION:</u> Drawings have been provided with the bid package for reference only. Additional drawings are available for review at Platte Generating Station offices. The Contractor is responsible for making such site visits as required to obtain additional details for bidding and execution of the work. The Contractor is encouraged to conduct a pre-bid site visit for clarification of any questions or concerns they may have related to the work scope and site conditions.

<u>CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL</u>: Every public contractor and his/her, or its subcontractors who are awarded a Contract by the City of the physical performance of services within the State of Nebraska shall register with and use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENT: The Contractor shall comply with the attached City's insurance requirements.

MINIMUM INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS CITY OF GRAND ISLAND, NEBRASKA

The successful bidder shall obtain insurance from companies authorized to do business in Nebraska of such types and in such amounts as may be necessary to protect the Bidder and the interests of the City against hazards or risks of loss as hereinafter specified. This insurance shall cover all aspects of the Bidder's operations and completed operations. Failure to maintain adequate coverage shall not relieve Bidder of any contractual responsibility or obligation. Minimum insurance coverage shall be the amounts stated herein or the amounts required by applicable law, whichever are greater.

1. WORKERS COMPENSATION AND EMPLOYER'S LIABILITY

This insurance shall protect the Bidder against all claims under applicable State workers compensation laws. This insurance shall provide coverage in every state in which work for this project might be conducted. The liability limits shall not be less than the following:

Workers Compensation Employers Liability Statutory Limits \$100,000 each accident \$100,000 each employee \$500,000 policy limit

2. BUSINESS AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY

This insurance shall be written in comprehensive form and shall protect the Bidder, Bidder's employees, or subcontractors from claims due to the ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle. The liability limits shall not be less than the following:

Bodily Injury & Property Damage

\$ 500,000 Combined Single Limit

3. COMPREHENSIVE GENERAL LIABILITY

The comprehensive general liability coverage shall contain no exclusion relative to explosion, collapse, or underground property. The liability limits shall not be less than the following:

Bodily Injury & Property Damage

\$ 500,000 each occurrence \$1,000,000 aggregate

4. UMBRELLA LIABILITY INSURANCE

This insurance shall protect the Bidder against claims in excess of the limits provided under employer's liability, comprehensive automobile liability, and commercial general liability policies. The umbrella policy shall follow the form of the primary insurance, including the application of the primary limits. The liability limits shall not be less than the following:

Bodily Injury & Property Damage

\$1,000,000 each occurrence \$1,000,000 general aggregate

5. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

The City may require insurance covering a Bidder or subcontractor more or less than the standard requirements set forth herein depending upon the character and extent of the work to be performed by such Bidder or subcontractor.

Insurance as herein required shall be maintained in force until the City releases the Bidder of all obligations under the Contract.

The Bidder shall provide and carry any additional insurance as may be required by special provisions of these specifications.

6. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

Satisfactory certificates of insurance shall be filed with the City prior to starting any work on this Contract. The certificates shall show the City as an additional insured on all coverage except Workers Compensation. The certificate shall state that thirty (30) days written notice shall be given to the City before any policy is cancelled (strike the "endeavor to" wording often shown on certificate forms). If the Bidder cannot have the "endeavor to" language stricken, the Bidder may elect to provide a new certificate of insurance every thirty (30) days during the contract. Bidder shall immediately notify the City if there is any reduction of coverage because of revised limits or claims paid which affect the aggregate of any policy.
